FOLLOWING, CHALLENGES US TO CHOOSE

In the First Reading from Jeremiah, we find that God blesses those who trust Him, while those who trust their own strength will be frustrated and cursed. Jeremiah uses the popular image of the Babylonian exile, those who trust in the Lord are like trees planted near running water, they will never wither or fade, for the Lord will be their strength. We humans, on our own, are incomplete. We can only flourish when relying on the Lord and His love. Thus, true wisdom is trusting the Lord. The Responsorial Psalm continues this theme of wisdom, using the same imagery of the Babylonian exile. Those who trust in the Lord will yield fruit like the tree planted near running water. The wicked, on the other hand, will dry up and be lost. Additionally, the good man has nothing to do with the wicked. In following God, we are called to make choices that separate us from certain things. The Gospel verse reminds us that we are in the world, but not of it, for our true home is in Heaven. In Luke's Gospel, we find the wisdom of the Beatitudes. There are four blessings and four woes. It puts this world's trials and difficulties in perspective, with future reward and living for a higher purpose. It reminds us that here there is a cost for following Jesus. Truly living for, with, and in Him, we will be denounced, excluded and insulted by those of the world, but God cherishes our fidelity and truthfulness. (CBCo)




