AS GOD'S CHILDREN, WE SERVE — The Responsorial Psalm continues the theme of serving the Lord in His holy dwelling place. This same idea is found in today's Gospel, where Jesus calls the temple in Jerusalem, his Father's house. The psalm speaks of making pilgrimage to the Lord's house, the one place where we find ourselves at home, where we can experience God's love unconditionally. Jesus came into the world, that we could experience His love here, in His presence. When we dwell in Him, He is our home. u The Second Reading, from St John, speaks of the great dignity the Lord has bestowed on us, not as slaves, but as God's children. He treats us with the same respect He treats His only-begotten Son, Jesus. He calls us to share His love and mission here on earth, and His glory in heaven, where we shall be like the One we love; not only sharing in His image and likeness, but truly one with Him. We know we are God's children when we keep His commands; living moral, giving lives. The commandments are not rules that imprison, but guidelines to help us choose what is right and good. They teach us virtue and generosity, especially if we live the greatest law, that of love. The Gospel scene shows Jesus at age twelve (when He discerned that He was both human and divine) among the teachers in the temple. It is at this time that Jesus declares that His Father is God in heaven. His three day absence can be seen as preparation for Our Lady who would be without Jesus again for three days, after He died and was buried. Now, as then, she learns to trust that He must be about His Father's business. As God's children, and with His grace, may we always turn our minds and hearts to Him in trust.

# "This is the Peace Light"

The International Peace Light/North American Peace Light will arrive in Our Lady of Grace Church on December 16 2023, and will be displayed for everybody to see and share during this holiday season. The International Peace Light project originated in Austria in 1986 and is dedicated to spreading a continuous flame, along with a message of peace and unity, from the birthplace of Jesus across the world. There are 15 oil lamps burning around the grotto at the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem, the birth city of Jesus. They have been maintained by the Greek Orthodox (6), Armenian Apostolic (5) and Catholic (4), churches and have burned continuously for more than 1,000 years. This flame is a symbol of peace and friendship. It reminds us that even though there is still much darkness in the world, you and I can overcome that darkness to create a peaceful community. There is a classic church saying that states "In essentials - unity, in non-essentials liberty or diversity, in all things-charity." Our faith does not have to be alike. We can live and work together in harmony and teach others to do the same The prophet Isaiah said, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness - on them light has shined." For Christians, many see The Peace Light of Bethlehem as symbolic of the Light of Christ, especially evident at Christmas, as meant to promote peace, harmony, and unity among all people of the world regardless of race, ethnicity, or creed. What starts as a small flame from the town of Jesus' birth, spreads person to person across the world with the message of promoting peace, harmony, and unity. The light of this flame is a visible reminder of the mission we all share: to keep the hope of peace alive in our homes, our communities, and our world.

Candles are available in the Church for a donation from which vou can light, and safely transport into your home this new year.


