Living in the Spirit and close to His Heart

The First Reading reminds us that the Messiah, our King and Savior, is not a conquering hero who rides into town on a great charger as the Jews thought, but one who is meek and gentle, riding in on a donkey. This King is victorious, for true love truly conquers. u The Responsorial is a hymn of praise to this King, our God, who though mighty and powerful, is also gracious and merciful. We praise Him because He did not abandon us in our folly, but reaches out to us with profound compassion, understanding our plight; willing to heal us by His own sacred wounds. He is not an angry God that will destroy us and all creation at the slightest infraction, but rather He is angry at the sin, not His children. When Jesus died for us on the cross, He bore our pain and showed the deepest compassion; He reached out to us when we were bowed low. u In the Second Reading, St Paul reminds us that God created the world good, but when we sinned, we hurt not only ourselves, but also creation, since that original sin made capable of misusing the others and the world. Sin causes good and evil to struggle within us. The Holy Spirit calls us to the freedom of God’s children and to truth. By choosing to live for and in God’s Spirit, we die to sin and help stifle the battle within. u In today’s Gospel, Jesus speaks of those who are invited into God’s wisdom, the simple, who are humble enough to listen to God. The proud and self-sufficient, on the other hand do not listen, but worse, tell God what they want Him to do. This is why Jesus invites the meek and humble of heart to Himself, offering comfort and healing. When we turn over our troubles to the Lord in humility, then we find incredible peace. This is not resignation, but surrender to His will. “Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make our hearts like unto Thine.” – prayer to the Sacred Heart. 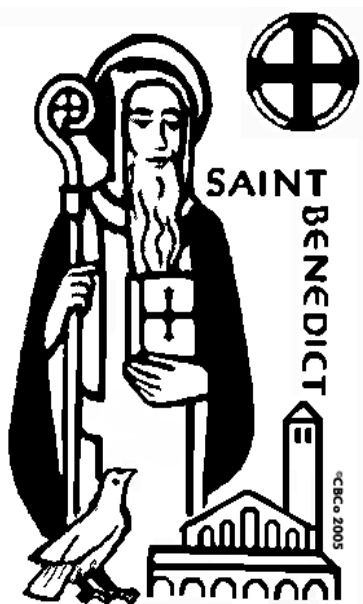
